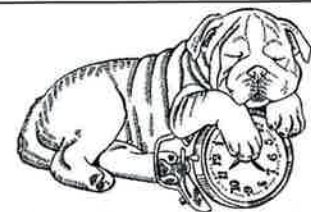

Daylight-Saving Time Ends


On Sunday, Nov. 7, at 2 a.m. Daylight Saving Time ends. To ensure that you make it to church at the right time, remember to turn your clocks back one hour Saturday night before you retire for the evening and while you're at it take the time to change your smoke alarm batteries!



Recently, I attended a seminar hosted by our Allegheny Synod on Youth and Family Ministry. At the center of the seminar were insights gathered from the latest research on what produces a healthy faith in young people. When asked what was important for your life in faith, the number one answer was mother followed by father. While there were differences between the sexes, it was the rankings that were most important. Church influences were not without impact but they paled in relation to family and friends. Specific church influences (pastor, youth group, christian education, church school teacher, church camp and youth group leader ranked third, fifth, sixth, ninth respectively). For all youth grandparents ranked equally with a youth group and for girls friends were more important than their Christian education and ranked equally with a youth group. The above tabulation was from a representative sample of 7th - 12th graders. The one influence that could be either principally church or home was the bible, which was roughly equal with friends. Clearly, the life of faith for our young people is being severely tested but this is nothing new.

Over three decades ago a Christian educator wrote a book entitled "Will Our Children Have Faith?" It was a call to action for Christian Churches. First communion among protestants came into being and confirmation programs were repeatedly overhauled. Clearly, some of this worked for our churches still have children and youth in them and many of

today's parents still bring their children and youth to youth group. Sunday school, worship and these parents were themselves products of this renewed effort but it was not enough. What was left out in these efforts was the influence of the home. It was largely neglected and this was a mistake. Children and youth learn far more of faith life from what they see at home than from the hour or two they might spend at church on a regular basis. We should have known better. When Martin Luther wrote The Small Catechism, which is still the basis of our confirmation programs, he also wrote the Large or Great Catechism to guide its presentation not by the church or pastors but most especially by parents. In Christian education then as today parents are by far the most important influence. For this reason while we will continue to try and have interesting youth events, faithful Christian education and reliable and safe church role models, we must work to make families in faith much more the centers of our efforts. We cannot do it alone. We need your help and we will do our best to offer our help as you do your job raising families of faith.

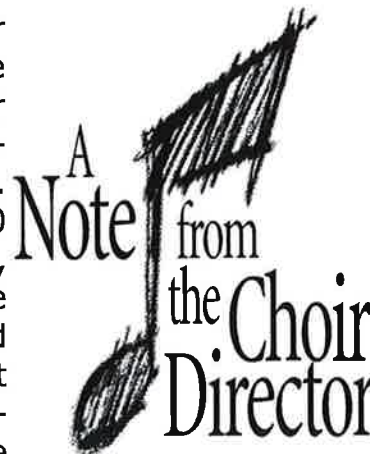

CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

OCTOBER 12, 2010**

CONGREGATIONAL / PEOPLE CONCERNS

A motion was made by Joyce Meese and seconded by Jim Suder to donate \$250 to the Berlin Fire department in conjunction with their annual fund drive. The motion passed.

Kathy Bell reported a member's interest in having an additional evening service, such as on Saturday or Sunday evening, to accommodate those who cannot make it to Sunday morning services. Discussion evolved into addressing a number of areas where we would like to see our services enhanced. A motion was made by Nita Swank and seconded by Lee Woida to create a worship committee that could further explore this interest. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

Finances – Homer Kreinbrook gave a report on church credit card research. After discussion a motion was made by Homer Kreinbrook and seconded by Joyce Meese to obtain a visa card through Somerset Trust with a combined \$5,000 limit for Pastor Harmon and Stephanie Brant. Motion passed.

Cannon Copier insurance - Pastor Harmon reported that upon research our current copier insurance is comprehensive so no additional insurance is needed.

Service personal hearing aides - Mike Countryman will continue to explore our options. A wireless service is costly, several thousand dollars.

NEW BUSINESS

As reported in last months meeting, Hilltop Floral will no longer be able to supply us with Christmas poinsettias and Easter Flowers. Homer Kreinbrook contacted a number of florists regarding Christmas poinsettia availability and cost. Upon discussion a motion was made by Darlene Hillegass and seconded by Wayne Schrock to purchase Christmas poinsettias at a discount of \$9 per plant. The motion passed.

The finance committee will be working on a 2011 budget proposal.

2011 Offering Envelopes - Upon discussion a motion was made by Darlene Hillegass and seconded by Joyce Meese to streamline the amount of envelopes in a box to 65 and order 250 boxes or a higher amount depending on potential price breaks.

Upon discussion a motion was made by Nita Swank and seconded by Homer Kreinbrook to donate \$100 to the Lutheran World Relief to assist in paying for quilt shipping costs and \$25 to Jack Hemminger for transportation of quilts to the shipping location. The motion passed.

PASTOR'S TIME

Pastor Harmon gave an overview of the information he received at a recent conference he attended. There is new research available on how youth connect with church.

Pastor will discuss with the youth the option of attending the National Youth Encounter in Chicago.

A motion was made by Nita Swank and seconded by Darlene Hillegass to have a single service on November 21, 2010 for the congregational meeting. The motion passed.
