As I write this message, my wife and 17 others from our church community are in the Dominican Republic, engaged in our first mission trip ever. In our March newsletter, we hope to feature pictures and reflections on the trip by some of the participants. As with any undertaking of this size, there were a few changes and stresses at the last minute, but all took off on time and landed safely in the Dominican Republic. While there they will meet children who are sponsored by this church through Compassion International, and they will work on constructing a dining hall for a new church camp being built by Summer's Best 2 Weeks in Jennerstown. Their mission, their safety and their return are in our prayers.

As we look forward to the coming month we will find the season of Lent at the end of it. On Wednesday, Feb. 25, we will remember our mortality due to human sin on Ash Wednesday with our service at 7 p.m. with the imposition of ashes. The night before we will host our traditional Fastnacht Dinner. (For more information, see our article beginning on Page 1.)

Before that, we enjoy the church season of Epiphany, which means the manifestation of God. In this season our new Alpha course, "Jesus of Nazareth" begins, and it will end in mid-April, just after the celebration of his Resurrection. (See the Alpha article on Page 3 for more



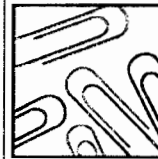
information.) Please call the Church Office at 267-5014 to register.

Lent begins with our annual Ash Wednesday service at Holy Trinity Feb. 25 at 7 p.m. On that night we will remember our life embedded in sin, our natural mortality because of that sin, and our fate without Jesus -- ashes to ashes, dust to dust.

We will also begin our Lenten journey to take hold of the hope offered to us through Jesus' sacrifice for our sins on the cross to the life in heaven he won for us. Our Lenten journey will seek to assure us of the reality of that hope and our capacity in Christ to reject sin and struggle to live a more Christian life.

As in past years, during the

five midweek services in Lent, the congregations of Holy Trinity, Berlin Brethren, Trinity U.C.C. and Three Seasons Community Church will participate in a rotating offering of Lenten services together. Services will begin each week at 7 p.m. at the host church and will conclude with the hour.

Speakers from each congregation will rotate, speaking at one of the other church sites. Then, at Berlin Brethren Church at noon on Good Friday, April 10, we will gather together with the additional participation of Berlin Missionary Alliance Church for remembrance of the day Jesus died.

Alpha course 'Jesus of Nazareth' continues

The current Alpha presentation is the theatrical movie and TV mini-series *Jesus of Nazareth*, which will be held at 7 p.m. Thursday evenings from Jan. 22 to April 16.

Each evening a video presentation is followed by a brief Bible study and discussion. Refreshments will be served.

There is no cost for the course and guests are always welcome, but indication of your presence and plan to attend will assist in arranging refreshments. A book entitled "Jesus: An Intimate Portrait of the Man, His Land and His People" by Keith Anderson will be offered as a helpful read-along resource.

In the event of an evening cancellation due to bad snow or ice, two evenings will be presented

The last couple of months I have been quite overwhelmed by so much.

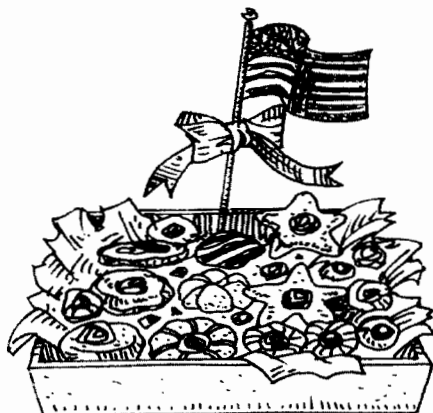

HEARTS in the morning

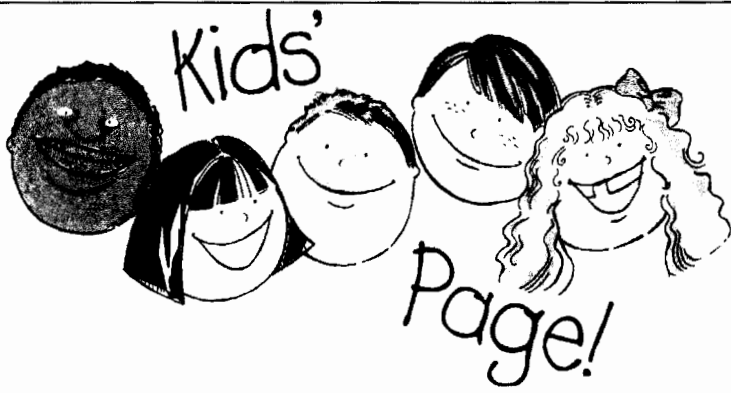
Start your morning with heart. Enjoy this special breakfast with someone you love!

What you need:

- Your favorite pancake recipe and syrup
- Pan or griddle
- Cooking spray
- Liquid measuring cup
- One 5-inch heart-shaped metal cookie cutter
- Wooden clothespin
- Spatula
- Adult help

What you do:

1. With an adult's help, follow your recipe to make your favorite pancakes.
2. Spray cooking spray onto your pan or griddle.
3. Pour pancake batter into a liquid measuring cup. (This helps with pouring individual pancakes.)
4. Place the cookie cutter on the pan or griddle. Then clip the wooden clothespin onto the cookie cutter to act as a handle.
5. Pour batter (about 3-4 Tablespoons) into the cookie cutter.
6. Cook until the top is bubbly and the pancake is dry around the edges.
7. When the heart is ready to flip, use the clothespin to lift and remove the cookie cutter.
8. Turn the pancake with the spatula and cook until golden on both sides. Enjoy with your favorite syrup or fruit.
