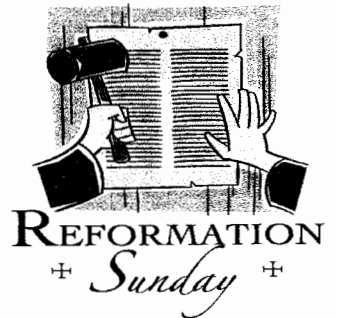
On Oct. 21 at the 10:40 a.m. service young people from our parish will be con-



firmed in their faith. This is a significant step in their journey of faith and we pray for these young people that

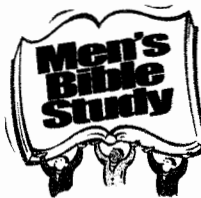
our Lord will help them keep the vows they make this day.

Honoring our Heritage, Moving Forward on Faith

On Sunday, Sept. 16, we celebrated the start of our 182nd year of Sunday School with our Rally Day. While contemporary scriptures and materials are used along with modern technologies (CDs, videos), the content remains the same. We study the story of Jesus and how he recruited disciples to bring the good news of our salvation and his building of a new kingdom of God. The disciples today are not Mr. Fletcher and Rev. Criegler, but you and I. Our questions are the same. How do we receive this gift and prepare to live in this kingdom? How do we tell others?

Even Mr. Fletcher and Rev. Criegler had to ask themselves the same question. The Sunday

School movement at the point they began in 1825 was then only 45 years old, having started in 1780 in Scotland under Robert Raikes. Questions they had to deal with then included what language to use -- English or German. What translation was not even an issue -- at the time there was only the King James in English or Luther's in German, except for a few minor alternatives. There was no materials available. Everything had to be created. What vocabulary would be used for children, what lessons would be taught, what stories would be emphasized -- these all had to be decided. As curriculums were created

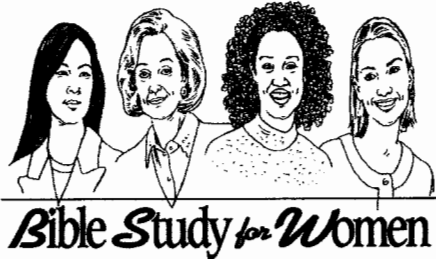

also offer a morning women's Bible study.

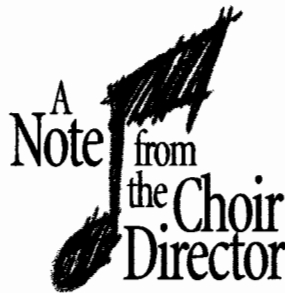

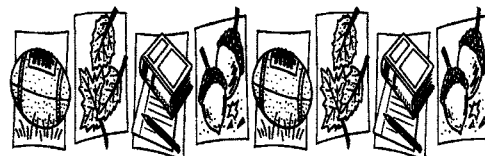

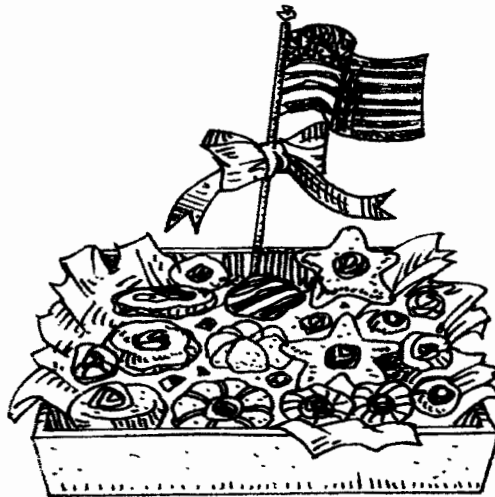
Dear members, family, friends and neighbors,

Church receives historical gift

During the last month the congregation received a significant historical gift. It is a small portable organ and wooden trunk that was used by the Rev. B.B. Collins and his wife Emma J. on their missionary pilgrimage to Africa.

Rev. Collins was a child of the congregation who accepted the call to ministry under the direction of Rev. Jess Wincoff, who was Pastor at Holy Trinity from 1844-45 and 1864-1872.

Unfortunately, on the 1876 sea voyage to Africa, Mrs. Collins became ill and succumbed to her illness. She was buried at sea.

Now the organ and sea trunk have come back home. They are a gift of Ann Fisher, now Gormer, who grew up in Berlin but



is relocating from Cumberland, Md. The gift comes to the congregation through the continued friendship of Eleanor and Robert Brick who have known Mrs. Gormer for many years.

We know the organ and trunk were used in Christian ministry by Rev. Collins. They may have been used in an earlier version of the church building either in church or Sunday School. They will be dedicated at a future time.

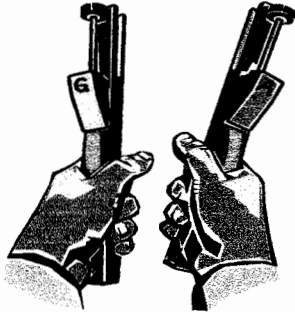
