## Holy Week Schedule set for Holy Trinity

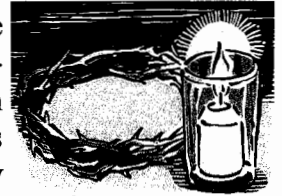
Holy Week at Holy Trinity will begin with our Palm **PALM SUNDAY** Sunday services at 8 and 10:40 a.m. April 1. These services, where we re-visit the Passion of our Lord, will also include communion. At 4 p.m. that afternoon we will also have an additional communion service.



Holy Trinity will have communion at our Maundy Thursday service at 7 p.m. April 5. We will recall the Last Supper and Jesus' commandment to his disciples that we love one another, just as He has loved us.

On the evening of Good Friday, April 6, we will hold our Tenebrae service at 7 p.m. Meaning "shadows"

in Latin, the Tenebrae service began in the early years of Christianity and recreates the **Service of Darkness** darkness those who knew and loved Jesus must have felt that night.



### Sunrise Worship

On Easter morning we will celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord with our annual Sunrise Service at 6 a.m., followed by breakfast in the Fellowship Hall. Our Sunday School students will hold their Easter program at 9:30 a.m., which precedes our 10:40 a.m. service.

# This is my Father's World

Snow is melting. Rain falls -- and grass, flowers, shrubs, trees and crops begin to grow. This is the phenomenon we here come to know as the cycles of nature.

It doesn't happen by chance. God said, "I command the earth to produce all kinds of plants, including fruit trees and grain." And that's what happened. The earth produced all kinds of vegetation. God looked at what he had done, and it was good. Evening came and then morning -- that was the Lord's day. (Gen. 1:11-13) What the Bible says in three verses took God most of a day and science says many millions of years. But of course, we don't know how long God's day was.

What we take for granted and science investigates for the intricacies of the how and the when is no less a miracle than the fact you're reading this passage. Scientists tell us every cell in the body is replaced every seven



years, so who is the "who" reading this? The cells or the creative pattern established by God that utilizes them? Constantly around us the glories and the beauty of creation should awaken us to the majesty and creativity of God.

Up until our day all the great scientists of the world have known this, and like their 20th century counterpart Einstein, have said: "I cannot believe that God plays dice with the universe." If even hard-headed scientists can see this, shouldn't we emulate their adoration of this creating God? "This is my Father's world" -- still.

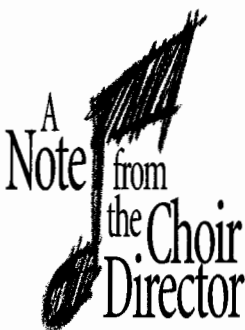
Dear Members,

**Holy Trinity places second in Souper Bowl competition**

The results of the Berlin area 2007 Souper Bowl have been released.

This year the contest was divided into two categories for large and small churches. In the large church category, Trinity United Church of Christ was the

winner with a total of 3,509 points. Holy Trinity was a close second with 3,487 points, and third place went to Berlin Brethren Church with 1,473 points..

In the small church category (less than 100 families in the congregation), Abundant Life



Christian Center was the winner with 1,108 points. Trinity Evangelical Lutheran came in second with 1,050 points, and Beachdale Church of the Brethren came in third at 858 points.

Overall, the 2007 Souper Bowl collected 1,776 food items and \$5,587 in monetary donations for the Berlin Food Pantry. This an increase from 2006, when 1,462 items and \$4,745,20 was collected.

Since July 1, 2006, the Berlin Food pantry has served 1,376 people. This includes 114 families in the Berlin and Shanksville School districts: 685 adults (161 of which are senior citizens) and 530 children.

## New sermon series begins April 15

## Easter Crosses









Make this craft to remember what Jesus did for us. Hang it in your room to look at all year long.



### What you need:

- Two 8" paper plates (white)
- Scissors 
- Pencil 
- Crayons, paints or felt markers
- Stapler, glue stick or glue
- Paper punch 
- Yarn, string or ribbon (about 10" or 12") 

### What you do:

1. With your pencil draw a slight curved line all the way across the center of one plate. This will be a hill. 
2. Draw three crosses on the hill. Make the center one a little bigger than the others. 
3. Color the hill green and the crosses brown. Or color the hill and crosses black to look like a silhouette. 
4. Cut out the hill and crosses as one piece. 
5. Color the top half of the other plate with red, orange and yellow to look like an evening sky. 
6. Staple or glue the hill-and-crosses plate onto the sky plate. Make sure you line up the bottom edges of the plates, and staple or glue just along the curved edges where the plates meet. 
7. Punch a hole near the top of the sky plate. 
8. Tie a loop of yarn, string or ribbon through the hole. 
9. Hang your scene on your doorknob or on something else in your room.

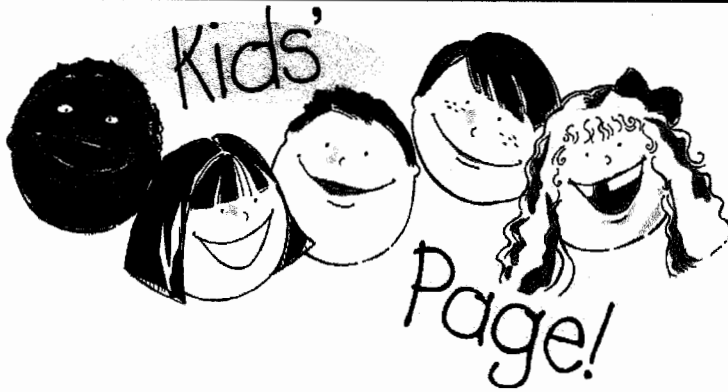
